Then he said, "It is the Lord; let him do what seems good to him."

SECOND READING

1 CORINTHIANS 6: 15-20

(The Passion Translation)

¹⁵ Don't you know that your bodies belong to Christ as his body parts? Should one presume to take the members of Christ's body and make them into members of a harlot? Absolutely not! ¹⁶ Aren't you aware of the fact that when anyone sleeps with a prostitute he becomes a part of her, and she becomes a part of him?
